A BRIEF REPORT OF REBUS NZ Inc AGM

Saturday 3rd May 2025 at 1.30 pm Palmerston North Leisure Centre.

The Waikanae Millennium Rebus Club was represented by David Funnell, Liz Thevenard and Barrie Truman. Garth Dutton Chairman guided the meeting and overviewed the clubs' activities and the health of the organisation. There were 23 clubs represented out of the 46 registered. Garth has made a point of visiting a number of clubs particularly in Auckland and he reported they were in a good state with small increases in membership. He and the committee are reviewing how Rebus can retain members and there will be a paper put out this year with suggestions and opportunity to have input.

There are several committee members leaving after many years. The administrator Graeme Mcintosh after 9 years, Secretary Sue Eckworth who had worked with distinction, and Jean Mcintosh Rebus NZ Club Newsletter editor who has continued in this role for 7 years and has written 90 editions. Rebus is insured with Lumley and covers all the Rebus Clubs. Rebus NZ said good bye to three clubs and the main reasons given were, an aging membership, inability to fill committee positions and the growth of retirement villages alternatives for social activities. There has been a significance influence on membership in the past 6 years from Covid but there appears to be new growth and Rebus NZ has turned a corner. Next year the meeting will be held in Whangaraoa by Paul Robinson. The Whangaraoa Club has 70 members and they are keen to host the clubs for the AGM.
